This traditional melody is known worldwide as the farewell song. As such, Jan Van der Roost has treated this arrangement it as an anthem for the end of the millennium. The piece ends, almost as if the musicians themselves are saying goodbye, to the century.

Nathan Hale Trilogy.....**James Curnow**

Nathan Hale (1755-1776) was an American patriot of the Revolutionary War. He was hanged by the British as an American spy when he was only 21 years old. His conduct and his courage have made him one of America's best remembered heroes. This triptych represents three important places or events in Nathan Hale's life.

- I. **Intrada-** *In July, 1775, he received a lieutenant's commission from the Connecticut assembly, and fought in the siege of Boston.*
- II. **Intermezzo- "Halesite":** *a monument that marks the place of his capture and death. Before he was hanged he made a speech, concluding with the words which have since inspired Americans, "I regret that I have only but one life to give for my country."*
- III. **Finale- "The Rangers"** *a small fighting group, of which he was a member, that were respected for their fighting qualities and their daring leadership in dangerous missions.*

Leroy Anderson was an American composer, arranger and conductor. He studied piano at the New England Conservatory of Music and composition at Harvard. After graduating, he served on the faculty of Radcliffe College and directed the Harvard University Band, for which he made many transcriptions and arrangements. In 1935, he became the permanent orchestrater for the Boston Pops Orchestra under Arthur Fiedler. As a composer, he specialized in light music for the standard orchestra, work which brought him renown in art- and popular-music circles. Bugler's Holiday, written in 1955 is an exciting and fun work which has inspired more trumpet players than any other piece of music this century.

O Holy NightAdolph Charles Adams

arranged by Calvin Custer

This haunting carol was written by Adolphe Charles Adam (1803-1856), the French composer best known for his ballet "Giselle." At the time, it was frowned upon by church authorities who denounced it for lack of musical taste and "a total absence of the spirit of religion." The French text is by Cappeau de Roquemaure; the English by American clergyman John Sullivan Dwight (1812-1893).

St. Martin's Suite.....Jan Van Der Roost

Movement 1: Andante Pomposo

This three-movement suite, written in 1991, was commissioned by the Royal St. Martin's Fanfare of Halle, Belgium, to commemorate the band's 110th anniversary. St. Martin's Suite was inspired by the life of St. Martin of Tours who died 397, and was the patron saint of the Royal St. Martin's Fanfare. The first movement depicts Martin as a soldier in the Roman army.

Homage to Perotin (from Medieval Suite)

Homage to Perotin is the second movement of Medieval Suite which was written in homage to the three great masters of the Middle Ages: Leonin (middle 12th century), Perotin (c. 1155-1200) and Machaut (c. 1300-1377) Homage to Perotin is neither a transcription of Perotin's works nor attempt at emulating his style. In this case Perotin's Viderunt served as a launching pad, drawing upon some of the characteristics of music from the medieval period, including: repetition of rhythmic patterns, modules of sound, proportions that produce octaves, fourths, and fifths, use of chant like melodies, syncopation, and long pedal points, while utilizing modern instruments.

Sarabande (from Courtly Airs and Dances)

Courtly Airs and Dances is a suite of Renaissances Dance characteristic of five European countries during the 1500's. The Sarabande used here is actually an ancient Spanish folk tune.

Where Never Lark or Eagle Flew.....James Curnow

Composer James Curnow was inspired to write Where Never Lark or Eagle Flew after reading the following poem by pilot John Gillespie Magee, Jr. This was the same poem quoted by President Ronald Regan in memory of the seven Shuttle Challenger Astronauts who lost their lives 73 seconds after launching on the morning of January 28th, 1986.

Highlight

Oh, I have slipped the surly bonds of earth
And danced the skies on laughter-silvered wings;

Up, up the long, delirious, burning blue
I've topped the windswept heights with easy grace
Where never lark, or even eagle flew.

Sunward I've climbed, and joined the tumbling mirth
Of sun-split clouds--and done a hundred things
You have not dreamed of--wheeled and soared and swung
High in the sunlit silence. Hov'ring there,
I've chased the shouting wind along, and flung
My eager craft through footless halls of air.

And, while with silent, lifting mind I've trod
The high untrespassed sanctity of space,
Put out my hand, and touched the face of God.

John Magee died on December 11, 1941 while flying a Spitfire in a dogfight.
